Noida residents have launched an online campaign against the proposed power tariff hiked of up to 26% for domestic consumers in the state. The proposed 26% hike in power tariff is grossly unjustified. NOFAA strongly protests on this proposed unreasonable hike. Noida Federation of Apartment Owners Associations (NOFAA) is running an online campaign against proposed revision.

Earlier, the minimum tariffs were Rs4.90 per unit and Rs6.50 per unit, which have been revised to Rs6.20 per units and Rs7.50 per

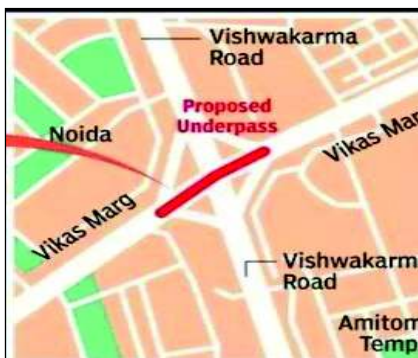
This was followed by the key attraction for our bubbly audience :- "A treasure Hunt

**Sector 71 Underpass work to start soon**



From mid July, sector 52/71 crossing will be shut for a year. This is because the work on the proposed underpass is set to begin next week. The tender for the construction of the six-lane,

780 metre underpass has been given to Mumbai-based multinational firm ITD cementation. The underpass will be developed at an estimated cost of Rs56crore, officials said. Noida authority officials, along with traffic police, went for a site visit on Friday to come up with a traffic diversion plan, which includes the currently operational U-turn near Sai Temple on sector 62 road and another one near sector 51 metro station. Officials said two

more U-turns will be constructed- one close to the sector 71 intersection near the foot over-bridge of sector 52 metro station on the captain Shashi Kant Marg and another one at Balaknath temple crossing on Vikas Marg on the way to Greater Noida (west). The underpass will benefit commuters travelling from Noida City Centre to Greater Noida (west), while those travelling from sector 62 towards Dadri road via sectors 51 and 52 will have a signal-free stretch above the underpass. This is one of the busiest crossings in Noida with a heavy flow of daily traffic.



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## Legally speaking: U.P. Apartment Act, 2010 and Model Bye-laws need several amendments (Part 2)

### 9. Clause 4 – Members of Association

There is an ambiguity in the matter of payment of entrance fee of Rs1000 by original owners (Sub-clause 1) and by purchasers in second sale (Sub-clause 2). As per the language used in Sub-clause 2, owners in second sale can be admitted as Members of Apartment owners Association (AOA) ONLY after payment of Rs1000. The language used in Sub-clause 1 “ and will pay the entrance fee of Rs.1,000 “ has created confusion among “ original owners “ community who hold that payment of Rs.1,000 as entrance fee is not mandatory and, in any case, it is not a pre-requisite for acquiring Membership of AOA. The same can be paid later on. There cannot be two different sets of principles for two categories of owners under Clause 4. We have yet to come across an Association Society/Forum etc which does not prescribe an admission/entrance fee as a pre-requisite for acquiring Membership. Sub-clause (1) needs to be amended on the lines of Sub-clause (2) so as to make payment of entrance fee of Rs1000 as a pre-requisite and a mandatory requirement for original owners

also.

10. Clause 8 -Voting on percentage basis Principle of 'one person, one vote' is universal. Bye-laws of Societies/Associations/ Welfare Forums etc registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860 provide for voting rights to its Members. But we have not come across 'voting on percentage basis' in any organization registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860. Model Bye-laws framed under U.P. Apartment Act, 2010 are registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860. There is absolutely no justification to introduce an altogether 'alien' concept of 'voting on percentage basis' under Clause 8. There is wide spread resentment among RWAs/AOAs about this Clause as it does not serve any practical purpose. The Clause should be suitably amended to provide for 'one person, one vote' to prevent creation of 'artificial classes' within the same class of owners in a Group Housing Society.

11. Clause 18- The Clause mandates that the affairs of the Association shall be governed by a Board. The Board of Management shall comprise of neither less than 4 nor more than 10 persons to be

constituted and elected by the members by simple majority in the General Body meeting. At the time of framing of the Model Bye-laws, the Govt. may have envisaged a few hundred apartments in a Group Housing Society. These days, all new Societies have thousands (not hundreds) of apartments. For proper and efficient management of a modern Society having thousands of apartments, the maximum strength of the Board, which, at present, is 10 is not considered adequate at all.

It is suggested that for Societies having less than say 500 apartments, the maximum strength of 10 office-bearers may be retained but for Societies having more than 500 apartments, one Tower/Block representative each for all the Towers/Blocks in a Society may be provided in the Board of Management, IN ADDITION TO 10 OFFICE-BEARERS, by making suitable amendment in Clause 18.

12. As per **Clause 18**, the Principal office bearers of the Association shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The Hindi version of the definition of the

'Board' makes it clear that 4 office-bearers have titles/designations attached to them. The remaining 6 persons also hold posts of office bearers without any title or designation. If a narrow and restricted meaning is given to the word 'post', there could be situations where people with 'clout' in the RWA/AOA could perpetuate themselves in the Board forever by switching on 4 positions in the Board- that of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer every 2 years. No law will ever allow/permit such a situation. The intention of the framers of Model Bye- Laws must have been to ensure that there should be a gap i.e. cooling off period after a person has held any post of office bearer with or without a designation / title continuously for 2 years. In a recent case the Hon'ble Supreme Court has stated that 'cooling off' must be accepted as a means to prevent few individuals from regarding the administration of cricket as a personal turf. The same principle of 'cooling off' period must also apply while interpreting Clause 26 suitable amendment to this effect needs to be made in second proviso in clause 26(1).

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# NOFAA STORY ON SWATCHH NOIDA CLEAN NOIDA

Noida Federation of Apartment Owners Associations (NOFAA) is a registered body (in 2017) under the provisions of the UP Apartment Act, 2010. Section 48 of the Model Bye-laws of the UP Apartment Act, 2010. It mandates every Apartment Owners' Association (AOA/RWA) in Gautam Budh Nagar district, to become its member. NOFAA has over 61 registered societies/apartments (high rise) enlisted as our members. A large amount of work has already been carried out by NOFAA on following:

1. Solid waste management 2016, 2. Fire safety in high rise, 3. Dust pollution, 4. Tree plantation
5. Social health services- 20 health camps, 6. Rain water harvesting, 7. Non-conventional energy sources- Solar, 8. Structural audits for high rise, Along with many other common social and civic issues.

## NOFAA Clean Noida Project



HCL Foundation awarded NOFAA for Noida Clean Project

NOFAA thrust for last 18 months has been in making residents aware on Solid Waste Management 2016 rules, its compliances and making as a result Noida clean. Our work primarily has been towards:

A. Creating behavioral changes, by educating people on Solid Waste Management 2016. More than 70 workshops have been conducted, FREE OF COST by NOFAA across various sectors and societies of Noida. Around 20 workshops have been conducted along with Noida Authority representatives and Adarsh Sewa Samiti (NGO working for Noida Authority).

## The workshops primarily covers:

1. Ministry of Environment 2016 rules and guidelines on SWM16
2. Role of Noida Authority in SWM and door-to-door waste collection.
3. Our duties in keeping the city clean, as citizens of Noida.
4. How to go about and manage waste segregation in societies. Wet, dry and home hazardous waste definitions.
5. Need for waste segregation. The disadvantage of landfills and hazardous effects on ground water.
6. Pollution and health hazards by living with waste in our surroundings.
7. Various techniques available for compost formation.
8. Creating awareness among residents thru various initiatives like
  - a. Painting competition for children on waste management and Environment
  - b. Nukkad Nataks

## c. Strong follow ups

d. Seminars and regular workshops (The outcome as a result of above workshops almost 20 high rise societies have already achieved 100% waste segregation and another 20 are in the process of implementation.)

## B. Inter society competition- NOFAA Swatch Society Award 2019

NOFAA conducted a inter society Swatch Society competition in the month of February 2019. There were 53 high rise societies which participated in this competition. There was a panel of judges who visited these 53 societies. The criteria for evaluating this was as follows:

1. Inspection of society for general cleanliness (50 Marks)
2. Area in society where garbage is collected and disposed off (25 marks)
3. The process of waste segregation and collection (25 marks)
4. General toilets in society (e.g. for maids and drivers (25 marks)
6. Inputs from three random residents (25 marks)
7. Round of outside the society along the boundary (50 marks)
6. Self assessment of RWA/AOA (50 marks) with proper justification.

TOTAL MARKS for evaluation: 250

The award ceremony happened on 26th May 2019 where three top societies and 9 other societies were rewarded.

## C. Swatch Bharat Survekshan 19 (& now SBS 20).

NOFAA observations. Our feedbacks to the governing bodies and our participation in its activities, directly or indirectly for making Noida top 10 cities of India. A sustainable model needs to be developed by the authority jointly with citizens' participation. RWA and AOA need to have active participation in this. We have been aggressively propagating the idea that all the Federation's of the town need to come together for making Noida clean

NOFAA has been aligning its own activities on Swatch Noida along with activities of

Noida Authority. The results of SBM 2019 for Noida gives us a great opportunity to do an introspection. Ranked 150 (an improvement from previous year 324, where possibly we had nothing in place) with following scores Citizen feedback 966/1250, Certification 100/1250, Service level Progress 492/1250

Direct observation 1036/1250. The current main area of concerns are in the Certifications and Service level Progress. These two actually would help us to develop and define a sustainable SWM model. The intent is to evaluate the grey areas and to push

the administration (Noida Authority) to the areas which need improvement in making Noida a clean place to live and as a result improve its overall



ranking. For example:

Certifications (1250) One of the main constituents for evaluating is:

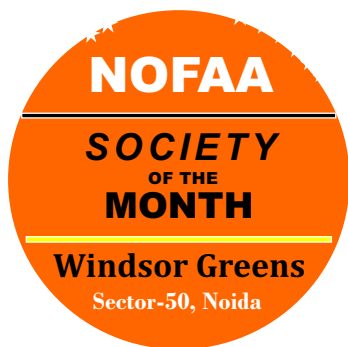

However, RWA showed resolute and managed Annual maintenance contracts for most of its equipments like LIFT (Full comprehensive AMC), DG Amc, Intercom Amc and Water Automation Amc. Complete Water Automaton was achieved by Windsor greens in Year 2017 and now there is ZERO water wastage or any plumber involved in filling of water tanks and operation of Pump. Windsor Greens

undertaken upgrading of its following facilities:

Fire Sprinkler system has been completely renovated this year along with fire alarms, fire Hydrants, including Fire extinguishers.

Gym has been full renovated with addition of new Commercial treadmill.

The lifts were audited by Kone and now all lifts have a lift safety Certificate.

Windsor greens is getting painted now for the first time after 14 years and in spite of Assotech not returning back IFMS.

Windsor Greens in now on Apna Complex with various discussion forums for the residents, their accounts maintenance and complete maid management, and moving towards visitor management.

Present RWA, was able to increase revenue by involving Ad Agency, TV and Lift Display and other revenue generation. With above, along with better finance management,

Windsor Greens RWA has been successful in not increasing any maintenance charges for third year in a row.

New benches have been added in the lawn and new signages have been installed. Gate façade beautification to be undertaken soon.

Lobbies of all 5 towers have been tiled recently giving a niche look.

We are in process of revamping the Club House with A TV and socializing area in the evenings, as also the pool table, TT table, cards table and Board games and Library.

Windsor Greens is a close knit society and residents do not miss even one opportunity to get together whether its Holi, Diwali, Dussehra, Lohri or new year.

In the coming year, Windsor greens

plan to start on Rain water harvesting as a pilot project.

Since its inception, NOFAA has been a guiding platform for Windsor Greens to understand our social responsibility, whether its waste segregation or working towards rain water harvesting or even arranging Senior Citizen forum meeting.

Windsor Greens, located in F Block of Sector 50, came into existence in 2005 when the first residents started moving in. The 9+ground floor complex of 5 towers was built by Assotech India Private Limited. The 164 residence apartment consists of 2, 3, 4 roomed & penthouses. Windsor Greens has been the most elegant complex in the area and people looked with awe at the lush layout of its garden. The Club house facility has swimming, gym, sauna/steam facility with table tennis, billiards and card tables. A large air-conditioned party hall with kitchen facility is available to the residents for their parties and get-together.

Assotech handed over the maintenance and management of the complex to the RWA in January 2011 but did not return the IFMS to the RWA. When the builder handed the society, there were several challenges, with accounts in haphazard shape and most of the equipments not having any warranty or any Annual maintenance contract.

moved towards complete CCTV monitoring of complex in 2018 with 32 cameras of High resolution. For security, Windsor Greens has two tier security covering gate as well as all 5 Towers. Windsor Greens was one of the First Society of F Block to achieve 100 percent waste segregation starting February 2018. Volunteer Ladies went home to home to train residents as well as maids on segregation of waste at source. It was not easy but now all residents and maids are segregating the waste at the source itself and housekeeping is giving separately to waste Collector engaged for the purpose.

However, biggest obstacle Windsor green is facing today is that Builder has till date not refunded the IFMS. Several meeting and assurances have gone waste. Mr. Mathur, has been instrumental in arranging reconciliation meeting with help of Noida Authority but builder failed to turn up after many letters and reminders from Noida Authority.

The present RWA took over in early August last year and since then has

## Save and reuse RO waste water



If you are using RO water purifier at your home or office then you can simply store the waste water in some tank or bucket and reuse that water for washing your car, watering in plants. Water with a TDS (total dissolved salts) level of 1200-1500 PPM can be safely used for car washing. If the TDS level of waste water is high you can mix tap water to dilute it. RO Purifier water waste is considered unsuitable for drinking and bathing due to high TDS content, but it can be used in many ways. Reports have

suggested that the waste water from RO purifiers, which are becoming a staple in every urban household, exceeds the amount of water that is actually purified by around three times. Imagine that 3 litres of waste water for every litre of drinking water. The purification process is slow and gradual, and in the process an alarming amount of waste water that seeps out from the other pipe. As attested by experts, this waste water is conventionally undrinkable. Due to the high content of total dissolved solids

(TDS), the water becomes unsuitable for drinking, and is not recommending for bathing either. The water also tends to contain inorganic salts and organic matter in varying quantities that adds to its unusable quality. Installation teams usually recommend setting up RO units over wash basins so that the water can trickle out. But even without consuming this water, there is a variety of areas in which you can make this water useful

1. Keep it for your car wash
2. Water your Gardens
3. Use it for household chores
4. Make it a staple for your washing machines
5. Use it in your toilets
6. Use in cooler

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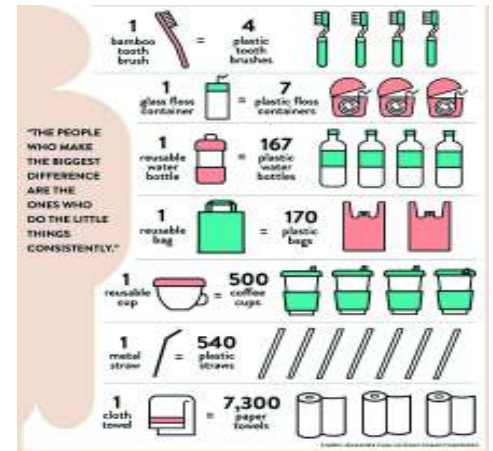
